Gary expressed concern about lack of participation in service at the Area level. He asked that the GSRs speak to their groups and stress the importance of service.

MINUTES HAVE NOT BEEN APPROVED BY THE TCASC

Lynn shared how service work has helped her grow.

There was discussion about the TCASC changing its name and redefining its boundaries. The following are different opinions expressed:

Steve K. explained that the Region had said it's the Area's responsibility to decide if the name and boundary change is appropriate.

The TCA used to include what is now the Area of Hope. There are meetings already crossing boundaries because there are new areas now.

We need to understand the reasons why we would change. When we define boundaries we risk excluding people. Some felt it's not in keeping with our traditions. People from the suburbs are also included.

Name should be Metropolitan Area.

We want to redefine because we no longer have an identity; wouldn't necessarily exclude anyone.

The Area of Hope was formed because of how many people, not because we could or could not cross boundaries.

We don't need to create boundaries for the sake of political correctness. Does it really need to change?

Twin Cities Area does establish boundaries in their bylaws. Renaming it Metropolitan Area would still create that.

Are boundaries required?

Perhaps a name that doesn't have geographical reference in it, i.e. Area of Hope, would be more inclusive.

NEW BUSINESS

Literature Chair will be up for election in May.

Motion 135 – presented by Fresh Start NA

Motion would create/change procedure of a committee and amends TCASC bylaws by replacing language on page 11, paragraph 11.10, and Article 3.

The motion read as follows:

Details for Funding and Operation of the Twin Cities Area Banquet

- The TCA Banquet budget will be separate from the TCASC budget. Operating funds for the TCA Banquet shall be maintained in a separate checking account.
- The chair of the TCA Banquet Committee, being elected by the TCASC, shall submit a budget, and timeline, to the TCASC. The TCA Banquet shall be budgeted to produce a profit. Expenses shall be based on real quotes from food vendors, venues and other vendors. Revenues shall be based on a realistic projection of tickets to be sold for the event at a specific price.
- Upon approval of the TCA Banquet Budget by the TCASC Executive Committee the TCA Banquet Committee shall be allocated \$1000 in seed money.
- This seed money amount should be sufficient to fund a deposit on the location, fund costs to hold fundraising dances or to purchase T-Shirts, mugs or other merchandise for sale.
- Proceeds from fundraising, whether dances, other functions, or merchandise sales, will be retained by the banquet committee in its separate checking account during the Banquet cycle. The Banquet Committee shall also retain funds generated by ticket sales.
- Upon completion of the TCA Banquet, all bills shall be paid by the banquet committee, all receipts and a full accounting of the TCA Banquet transactions during the Banquet cycle, will be turned over to the TCASC Treasurer along with all remaining Banquet proceeds. Upon completion of the TCA Banquet Committee's final report, the TCA Banquet books shall be audited by the TCASC Treasurer.
- At this point the balance from the TCA Banquet becomes part of the operating cash flow for the TCASC with \$1000 being reserved for the upcoming TCA Banquet Committee

This motion will be voted on in May. GSRs – please bring this to your groups for discussion and group conscience.

Regional Delegate (RD) Report to the Minnesota Region

Items Of Note To Be Shared With Areas, GSR's, Groups, Meetings, & Other Interested Narcotics Anonymous Members & Supporters

Jane H. and Tony M. (your Regional Delegate team) have brought together the following information in an effort to inform you, the members of the Minnesota Region, about issues and events currently happening in Narcotics Anonymous (NA) during this busy time preparing for the World Service Conference and enjoying MNNAC XIII. This double-sided report is a synopsis of Fellowship events and issues. Full information on all of these topics is available from either Jane or Tony, and is also online at either www.na.org or <http://www.naminnesota.org/>.

2006 World Service Conference (WSC): Your Delegate team will attend the 2006 NA World Conference in Woodland Hills California from April 23 – 29, 2006. Over the course of the week, we will be in discussions with other delegates from around the world, and will also meet with the World Board to look at and make decisions about several issues of interest to the Fellowship. Those issues are addressed in the Conference Agenda Report (CAR). A CAR summary sheet was passed out to Regional Committee Members (RCM) during the previous two Regional Service Committee (RSC) meetings in December and February. Another part of the World Conference is discussing and making decisions about service issues. Those issues are included in a separate document known as the Conference Approval Track (CAT). Summary sheets of the CAT have been given to RCM's for distribution to their Areas. The CAT is also available online at: <http://www.na.org/cat2006/>. The username is "cat" and the password is "cat2006". Summaries of both the CAT and the CAR are available online at: [The NA MN Website](#).

Regional Assembly: The Regional Assembly was held on March 11, 2006. A copy of the results is available online at <http://www.naminnesota.org/regional/regional.htm>, and there are also some hard copies available to be handed out at the RSC meeting today. Due to several issues (both in and out of your RD's control), the second mailing to meetings and GSR's did not occur. We apologize for this. In light of an approximate 8% GSR turnout for the Assembly, ballots and instructions were printed and sent to all MN Region meetings, with instructions to return the ballots by April 19, 2006. During the planning of the Assembly, it was clear the Assembly Guidelines needed to be updated, reflecting the changes in our Fellowship and the World Conference.

CAR Workshops have been occurring since December. Your delegate team has visited Southwest MN, Lakes, Recovery In The Heartland, Central Minnesota, Metro Area, Open Door, South Suburban Fireside, and the Back to Basics Area (today during MNNAC). Copies of the results of all the workshops are available online at <http://www.naminnesota.org/regional/regional.htm>. Jane and I would like to thank all the RCM's who made all the arrangements, and we'd also like to thank all the addicts who warmly welcomed us into each of their areas and taking part in the Workshops. Our recovery is stronger for your hospitality and participation! We hope yours is too.

Other News of Note:

Narcotics Anonymous World Services (NAWS) News: (over)

- **Basic Text Project:** NA's Basic Text stories will be re-written, and submitted to the 2008 World Service Conference for approval. To date, NAWs has received over 600 stories. In the next six months, interviews will be taking place, trying to fill in whatever gaps are noted (committee-identified groups whose stories weren't submitted but will be included in the updated Basic Text). The review and input draft of the Basic Text will be sent out September 2006 to be completed by March 2007. The approval form draft will be sent September 2007.
- **Posting IP's on the Web:** NAWs staff continues to post Information Pamphlets (IP's) to the NA website, along with the Guide to Local Services (GTLS), which is an excellent resource for GSR's. Both Jane and I highly recommend it.
- **Traffic at NAWs Website:** They receive approximately 2 million "hits" each month, IP#1 (Who, What, How and Why) is downloaded about 1000 times a month, and the GTLS has been downloaded over 19,000 times since July. During 2005, all web pages at NAWs were viewed almost 30 million times!
- **Worldwide Workshops:** World Board members and NAWs Staff have attended several Workshops in Portugal, Ukraine and Lithuania. Participants included Slovenia, Slovakia, Croatia, Moldavia, Bulgaria, Poland, Latvia, Lithuania, Estonia, Serbia and even parts of Siberia. Translation workshops have also been attended in Bangkok as part of the Asia Pacific Forum (APF), and NAWs attended Malaysia's first convention held in Kuala Lumpur in February. NAWs was also able to attend eight multi-regional CAR Workshop events since December, all within the United States.
- **World Convention Update:** The schedule for upcoming World Conventions has been updated to include 2013. #32 will be in San Antonio Texas in August/Sept. 2007, #33 will be held in Barcelona Spain during August 2009, #34 will be held in San Diego California in September 2011, and the final decision was to hold World Convention 35 in Philadelphia Pennsylvania in August/Sept. 2013. Philadelphia was chosen over Minneapolis, Indianapolis, Toronto and Orlando, mainly due to financial and operational viewpoints, and the fact that the United State's eastern seaboard (between Washington D.C. and New York) is NA's most densely populated membership area in the world.
- **March Conference Report (MCR):** The MCR will include the final selection candidates for the World Board, the Human Resource Panel and Co-facilitator open positions at the upcoming WSC. If you would like to participate in service at the World level and have at least 5 years clean, please fill out the World Pool Information Form. It is available at <http://www.na.org/HRP/wpif-default.htm>. Currently there are 740 members of the World Pool.
